**A Mentorship Program through the Ohio Wildlife
Rehabilitators Association**

Dear OWRA Members,

In an effort to support and encourage new individuals to the field of wildlife rehabilitation, OWRA is launching ***Reach & Teach***, a mentorship program designed to offer assistance to members who have completed OWRA's *Introduction to Wildlife Rehabilitation* training.

In 2011, over 60 individuals completed the IWR training and this program hopes to bridge the gap between the classroom training and the actual receiving of animals for rehabilitation. In addition, this program will not only provide hands-on experience and networking opportunities for the new rehabilitator but will also benefit the hosting facility/individual with additional support.

OWRA is inviting member facilities and individuals permitted through the Ohio Division of Wildlife to reach out and teach new rehabilitators through methods such as on-premise volunteering, facility tours to share ideas, and/or phone availability to offer advice.
